Hot Tip for the Month -Hydration

Until these last couple weeks, we have had a relatively mild summer. It is particularly important, however, when the thermometer rises and the sun beats down to protect yourself while you are out in your gardens.



Your plumerias need special care in hot weather, as well.

- Remember where Plumeria thrive naturally- tropical Mexico, the Caribbean and Hawaii. Hot, humid and very well-drained soil.
- Here in Southern California, our climate is quite different. Summer air is dry, and winter wet, and soil may be very tight.
- Those big, beautiful leaves transpire large amounts of water in the hot days Aug-Sept, drawing from the soil- if available, or the strength of your plant if not.
- Remembering you initially planted in very well-draining soil, soak plants through during these hot days. When the soil has dried out- water again. This may be a week in cool coastal areas or the next day in hot inland areas when windy.
- Mist the canopy early morning or evening hours to further reduce the impact of heat stress.

Remember- warm moist air carries scent much more efficiently

- Operating the store
- Updating sound equipment
- Possible relocation of storage to closer (less costly location)

- Maintaining insurance, membership in Cal Garden Clubs
- Fund raising including cutting sales, and silent auctions,
- Planning and serving the Luau.
- Others which I obviously forgot.


Most of the current Board is "timed out" of our current positions. One can only serve two terms (4 years) in a position. That said, all are very willing to help the new Board once established.


